# SEAICRN Data Sharing Plan: SEA050 (Sepsis Study)

## What data will be shared?

The de-identified and anonymized raw study data associated with the collected samples of the sepsis study will be uploaded to a web-based repository site in an excel format. This data set will be called 'shared data set' from this point forward. The shared data sets will only comprise all data variables included in each sepsis study manuscripts for publications. The shared data sets will conform to relevant data and terminology standards. The shared data sets will have been cleaned and verified according to standard procedures in compliance with ICH GCP.

## Where will the shared data sets be available?

The sepsis study data will be securely uploaded to Figshare ® (<u>https://figshare.com</u>), an internationally recognized open-access data depository place, which is a free online digital repository site operated by Macmillan Publishers.

### Who will have access to the shared data sets?

The shared data sets will be publically available and accessible by both collaborating investigators and research groups, and the wider research community.

### When will the data be shared?

Each sepsis study shared data sets used to develop a specific manuscript will be uploaded onto an internationally recognized open-access data depository place and made publicly available once the manuscript has been published.

#### How will researchers locate and access the data?

By uploading the shared data sets on the open access site, the shared data sets will be legally available for use, without permission or fees, for virtually any purpose. The shared data sets may be copied, distributed or used as long as SEAICRN as the original source of the data is properly cited in all tables, reports, presentations, and scientific papers by any researchers who wishes to access the data for scientific purpose (under CC-BY 4.0).
